TURN CLOCKS BACK ONE HOUR ON SUNDAY: When Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 6, many people will find themselves spending more time driving in the dark. Depth perception, color recognition and peripheral vision can be compromised



in the dark and the glare of headlights from an oncoming vehicle can temporarily blind a driver. Even with high-beam headlights on, visibility is limited to about 500 feet, creating less time to react to something in the road, especially when driving at higher speeds. Pedestrians in dark clothes walking in the street may not be seen at dusk. What should you do to combat darkness? --Make sure you SLOW DOWN to compensate for limited visibility and reduced stopping time, headlights are clean; --Dim your dashboard; --Look away from oncoming lights; --Clean the

windshield to eliminate streaks; --WEAR COMPANY JACKETS WITH REFLECTIVE STRIPES!

IDLING POLICY: With temperatures turning colder, please refresh yourself with the Idling Policy in our SSPP Safety Manual (Section 14.10). Please refrain from leaving your bus unattended in the yard or anywhere else while it's running and never let it run for more than 5 minutes unless the engine needs to be running to operate safety equipment or the temperature is below 24° [F]. All buses also need to be turned off while on school grounds except in the case of student special needs accommodations. Remember, the GPS technology automatically records idling time which can result in disciplinary action or the reimbursement of any fine imposed on the Company.
