NON-VERBAL STUDENTS: There are three primary ways that students can communicate with you while riding on your bus. The three ways to communicate are through:

- 1) Physical gestures students who use physical gestures can communicate with you by clapping their hands, blinking, fist pumping and pointing at something they want. A DA shared an experience when one of her nonverbal riders reached out to hold her hand in a time of discomfort and in response, she took hold of that hand to comfort her. When you recognize a student's attempt to interact with you, it becomes easier to build a positive relationship with the students on your bus which results in a safer bus ride for everyone.
- 2) Sounds pay close attention to the sounds that your riders make while transporting them. Their high-pitched squeals can help you learn how they are feeling. Take a moment to listen for patterns. For example, do some of your riders make soft squealing sounds that become louder and more intense? Do the students begin to rock their body after these sounds become louder? At this time, the students may be showing you they are feeling happy, sad, stressed, etc.
- 3) Touch the act of touching is another way that non-verbal students use to communicate with you. They may try to touch another person's face or touch their own smile to show you that they are happy.
