OCTOBER IS NATIONAL PEDESTRIAN SAFETY MONTH: The personal, physical and environmental benefits of walking can lead to healthier, quieter, cleaner and safer streets. However, a distracted driver can change all of that. On average, a pedestrian was killed every 71 minutes and injured every 9 minutes in traffic crashes in 2021. If you see a crosswalk, expect a pedestrian. In fact, always expect pedestrians, they are distracted too and may not be aware of you. Do not walk in the yards on your cell phone.

NON-VERBAL STUDENTS: When students are considered to be nonverbal, it means that they don't use words to express what they are thinking or feeling. Some people think because these students don't talk, they don't communicate at all. This is not true. During the training, "She Has a Voice", a team member shared a story about one of her riders who had cerebral palsy. The student's mother shared that despite her immobility and silence she was aware of what was going on around her. She was able to understand what people were doing and saying without any signs of awareness. This is an example that, although this student was very quiet, she was able to learn. We can use this as a reminder of what we do and say while working can have an influence on the children around us. Watch upcoming Newsletters for further information.
