SUMMER WORK: Yes, we are planning our summer season! Sign-up is now available on My Parking Space. Click on the Sun icon on your mobile device to sign up. All drivers and driver assistants hired January 1, 2019, or later need to sign up for summer work and attend the pick. If we have enough employees, you may get the opportunity to pass on summer work. Remember, summer programs are 6-8 weeks in duration.

UNIFORM POLICY: As the weather gets warmer, we want to gently remind our employees to adhere UNIFORM POLICY to our uniform policy. For School Bus Operations, we have a strict "waist up" policy, meaning only company-issued attire with the STS logo must be worn from the waist up, including always wearing the uniform for charter work. Pants and shorts must be neat, clean, and not ripped or tattered. They must be solid in color: blue, black, brown, or khaki. Jeans are permitted. Spandex pants, spandex shorts, sweatpants, and sweat shorts are not permitted. For Transit Operations, all drivers must follow the uniform code with uniform parts purchased through "Goldman Brothers." ID badges must always be worn and visible for all employees.

SECURING YOUR BUS: The consequences of a bus not being secure can be very dangerous. A rolling bus at the platform of the school can be deadly. To secure your bus at the platform:

- Step 1. Pull the parking brake (large bus) or set the parking brake (van) keep foot on brake.
- Step 2. Shift bus into Neutral (large bus) or shift to Park (van).
- Step 3. Turn front wheels in proper direction if on incline or decline.
- Step 4. Turn the ignition off.
- Step 5. Follow the vehicle's procedure to disarm Child Check/take key if leaving bus.
