<u>CHROMEBOOK CHALLENGE ALERT</u>: A social media trend called the "Chromebook Challenge" encourages students to insert metal objects into Chromebook USB ports causing dangerous short circuits. This can trigger battery failure, fires, or explosions and has the potential to release toxic, flammable vapors. Precautions to take include not touching the device, unplug device if it is safe to do so. Follow the R.A.C.E. fire response: R – Rescue, A – Alarm, C – Confine, E – Evacuate. Report tampering immediately, notify your supervisor immediately. Tampered devices may fail later, even off school grounds, never charge a suspected device.

REAR-END COLLISION PREVENTION: Rear-end collisions are among the most common—and preventable—traffic accidents. As school bus and transit drivers, you carry precious cargo and play a critical role in road safety. These incidents often result from following too closely, distractions, misjudging stopping distances, sudden traffic changes, or failing to adjust to weather conditions. Even a brief lapse in attention can have serious consequences. To help prevent these accidents, always maintain

a safe following distance by using the 4-second rule and increase it to at least 6 seconds in poor weather. Stay focused by keeping your attention on the road and avoiding distractions such as phones, eating, or adjusting controls. Anticipate traffic flow by watching several vehicles ahead for brake lights or sudden stops, giving yourself more time to react. Brake smoothly and early to help prevent collisions and allow drivers behind you time to respond. Finally, adjust your driving for conditions like rain, fog, snow, or bright sunlight, which can reduce visibility and increase stopping distance. By staying alert and practicing these habits, you help ensure a safer ride for everyone on board—and on the road.
